Dennis F. Thompson, PhD, is the Alfred North Whitehead Professor of Political Philosophy Emeritus at Harvard University, and the founding director of the university-wide Edmond J. Safra Center for Ethics. Dr. Thompson's books include: Restoring Responsibility: Ethics in Government, Business, and Healthcare; Just Elections: Creating a Fair Electoral Process in the United States; Ethics in Congress: From Individual to Institutional Corruption; and Political Ethics and Public Office. He co-authored (with Amy Gutmann) The Spirit of Compromise: Why Governing Demands It and Campaigning Undermines It; Why Deliberative Democracy? and Democracy and Disagreement. His work on conflict of interest in medicine is widely cited, and provided the framework for the report of the Institute of Medicine's National Committee on Conflict of Interest. Dr. Thompson has served as a consultant to the American Medical Association, the U.S. Senate Ethics Committee, the Food and Drug Administration, and the South African Parliament, among other bodies. At Harvard, he twice served as Acting Provost, and later as Senior Adviser to the President. He received a first class honors degree in philosophy, politics and economics from Oxford, and a doctorate in political science from Harvard.
